For the entire year, the library fully open, with in person programming, updated collections, and meeting room use for the public. We were delighted to welcome back our patrons, many for the first time since the pandemic began, as we navigated the new realities of public library service.

Community engagement with the library was evident in the data and patron feedback we received. Notable statistics included:

- ⇒ Circulation of physical and electronic items: 229,254
- \Rightarrow Programs: 704 programs were attended by 9,719 people
- ⇒ Patron Visits: 61,303





Programming, Outreach & Partnerships

2022 was a year for new and innovative programming at OFL. During February Break Week, the whole first floor of the library was transformed into a life-sized Candy Land game. In just a week, an estimated 200 families stopped by the library, played the game and won prizes. In April/May, through \$10,000 awarded to OFL by the Central New York Library Resources Council (CLRC) as part of the American Rescue Plan Act, our Digital Services and Technology Librarian presented a 4-week class in which he taught families how to build a functional, Internet-enabled computer. At the end of the program, the 8 families who participated were able to keep the computer that they built!

Thanks to strong partnerships with local organizations and school districts, we were able to offer new events to our community – highlights include a rocket build and launch with the Syracuse Rocket Club, bird and tree identification nature walks led by NYS Parks, local history programs presented by the Town of Onondaga Historical Society and Daughters of the American Revolution, suicide prevention program with Contact Community Services, GSA programs featuring special guests from the Syracuse Q Center, childhood development programs with Help Me Grow Onondaga and ACR Health and more.

Summer Reading

We had an amazing summer and thank you to all who participated in Summer Reading!

- ⇒ Total Summer Reading Participants: 505
- ⇒ Total Books Read: 5,250

Thank you to the Friends of Onondaga Free Library for supporting our entire Summer Reading program, providing \$3,000 in funding for prizes and programming, including new toys for the children's area, activity kits for kids who registered for summer reading, program supplies and guest presenters. This summer we transitioned back to hosting all programs in-person at the library. Thank you Gannon's Isle Ice Cream and Fairmount Glen Mini-Golf for providing our prize incentives for children and teens. To all the happy families that visited OFL this summer, thank you for enjoying our programs, collections and beautiful space.

The Friends of Onondaga Free Library held successful fundraising and membership campaigns in 2022. Proceeds from their fundraising efforts provided support for the library's collections, including Lucky Day books, eBooks, Empire Passes (NYS Park Passes) as well as a new teen Manga collection, a refresh of the juvenile non-fiction collection and replacements of many well-loved titles. The Friends also funded a new art hanging system for the Teen Space, a caterpillar hanger unit for Storytime-to-Go kits and
