JavaScript II: Memory Game

3-day class: 7/17, 7/18 & 7/19, 6-8pm

In this intermediate-level course, hone your JavaScript skills through the use of several key concepts in computer programming: arrays, objects and loops. Use these concepts, in combination with some basic HTML and CSS, to design, construct and test a JavaScript-powered Memory Card game. *Prior experience with JavaScript is strongly encouraged, but not required. Class is designed for those with a beginner's understanding of JavaScript.*

Laptops provided for in-house use during each session. Participants encouraged to bring their own USB flash drive (4GB+) to save their program code.

Intro to A.I.

2-part class: Fridays, 8/4 & 8/11, 2:00-3:30pm

Artificial Intelligence (A.I.) is changing the world around us. From self-driving cars to facial recognition software, A.I. is being used in a variety of ways to make our lives easier and more efficient. But what exactly is A.I., how does it work, and what are the consequences of its use? This two-session program will provide a basic overview of A.I., including its history, types, and applications, and will allow participants to interact with Google's Bard A.I. chatbot and Midjourney's art generation A.I. A discussion of the political, social, economic, and ethical implications of A.I. will accompany the use of these powerful tools.

No prior experience with Bard or Midjourney is required. Program description authored in collaboration with Google Bard. Image generated in collaboration with Midjourney.

With the 149th: Onondaga County Infantry in the Civil War <u>Tuesday, 7/25, 6:30-8:00pm</u>

On the evening of July 2, 1863, soldiers of the 149th Infantry Regiment waited nervously atop Culp's Hill for the Confederate charge they knew to be imminent. Mustered in Syracuse the previous October, these men of Onondaga County found themselves at the center of a pivotal moment in the Battle of Gettysburg. Their courage and resolve to hold Culp's Hill would turn the tide of the engagement and, ultimately, of the Civil War. OFL's Digital Services & Technology Librarian and Andrew Miledonis of the Town of Onondaga Historical Society, will focus on the Battle of Gettysburg and the decisive role played by Onondaga County's own 149th Infantry Regiment. We'll examine how the battle unfolded, describe the actions taken on Culp's Hill, and hear first-hand testimony of what is was like with the 149th.

Diverse Voices Book Club Crying in H Mart by Michelle Zauner Wednesday, 7/12 at 7pm




PARTMEN
